

Local student wins prestigious epilepsy scholarship June 8, 2012

Epilepsy Ontario is proud to announce that Ottawa's Michel Leroux won an OBCL Epilepsy Scholarship. Upon graduating from École secondaire catholique Franco-Cité, the 18-year-old plans to continue his studies at La Cité collégiale. He has been accepted into the *production télévisuelle* program, and hopes to one day work in the television industry.

“What really strikes me is that they [the scholarship applicants] all admit that they live with epilepsy, and they all see a positive side to it,” said Lawton Osler, founder of the OBCL Scholarships and chair of the awards ceremony on June 6.

Leroux is one of eight recipients across Ontario to receive an award funded by Osler Business Consulting Ltd. Each applicant submitted a personal essay under the theme, “How Epilepsy has Shaped My Life.” The OBCL Epilepsy Scholarship awards students who are transitioning from high school to college or university.

Epilepsy is the second most common neurological disorder after headache, and can develop at any age. One in 100 Canadians lives with epilepsy, including 1.4 million in Ontario.
